Many international conventions, exhibitions and festivals are driving Busan to become an international tourism and entertainment capital.



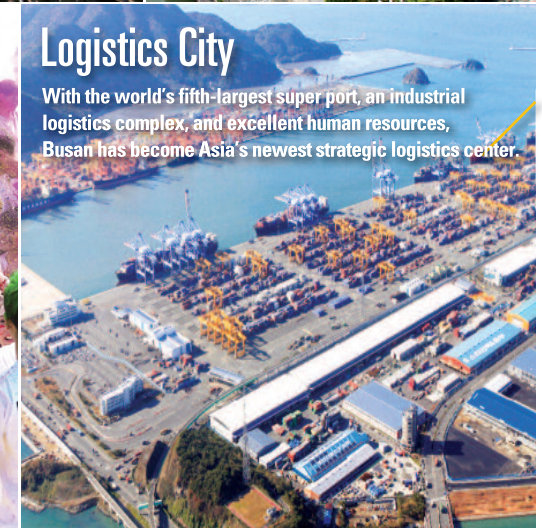
### Commercial City

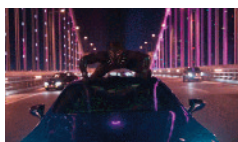

### “Busan by the Sea”

Take a stroll along Songdo’s pristine beach on the way to catching the new cable car ride to experience a panoramic view provided by one of Korea’s newest tourist attractions. The transparent floor of every cable car offers a breathtaking glimpse of the ocean below. Visit the National Maritime Museum in western Busan and learn about the city’s incredible relationship with the sea. See Jagalchi market, one of the largest seafood markets in Korea. Furthermore, Taejongdae on Yong Island is famous for its rock beach below a ocean cliff peak of 250 meters including forests of pine trees and 200 other varieties of trees.

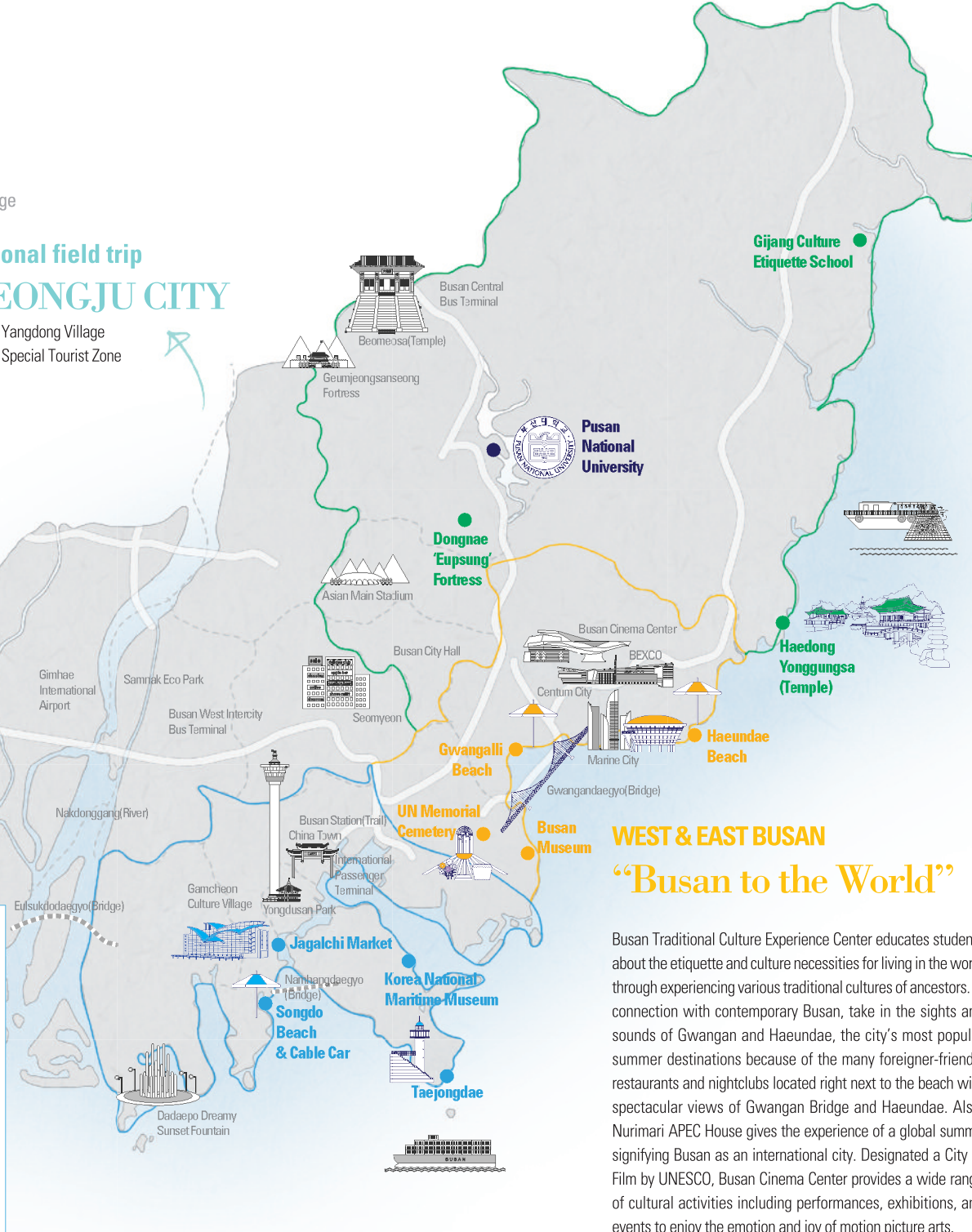

## NORTH BUSAN

### “Busan through History”

Haedong Yonggungsa Temple is situated on the coast just northeastern of Busan. This superb attraction offers visitors the rare find of a temple along the shoreline; most temples in Korea are located in the mountains. Visiting Gijang Culture Etiquette School affords experiencing a traditional education of culture and manners while wearing traditional clothes and playing Korean instruments. In order to fully appreciate Busan’s multifaceted history, a trip to Dongnae Eupseong Fortress will allow you to experience Korea’s repelling of Japanese invasions during the 1590s, and is one of Korea’s ‘national treasures.’

Participants will be matched with Korean students from PNU who will help them adapt to Korean culture and the city.

## ◆ Accomodations

Dormitories are available to Summer School participants. Rooms are fully furnished and include twin beds (two students per room). Meals are provided at the dormitory cafeteria without extra charge (cooking is not permitted). Other facilities include showers, laundry facilities (coin-operated washing machines and dryers), student lounges, and a gym. Every room is equipped with LAN connections for Internet use.

## ◆ Medical Insurance

Program fees do not cover medical insurance for participants. Students must purchase their own medical insurance before arriving in Korea.
