WHAT IS THE SPRING SCHOOL – EUROPEAN UNION STUDIES IN RIGA?

The Spring School – European Union studies in Riga is all about politics in the European Union: Learning new skills in public administration, as well as international and comparative politics. The Spring School aims at widening the range of students' knowledge on the European Union, its operating framework, Europeanization and European values. The knowledge and skills that you gain, as well as the experience of living in Latvia, one of the most dynamic countries in the EU, will enhance your professional development.


The Spring School offers students two study programs: (1) European Union studies—Foreign Affairs and (2) European studies-Domestic Affairs. The first programmes study courses are focused on the European Union's foreign policy developments. The second program focuses on the European Union's domestic issues, such as government organizations, decision making processes and the Latvian political experience.

The Spring school EU studies-Foreign Affairs programme aims enhance knowledge about European Union activities, its operating framework, the Europeanization process and the fundamental values in democratic society. The EU studies–Internal Affairs focuses on the Latvian political experience as a European Union member state – political regime

transformation, institutional functioning, as well as the public administration reform process since independence and the modernization process of public administration.


SPRING SCHOOL PROGRAM:


1. Lectures: The Department of Political Science, faculty of Social Sciences at the University of Latvia will offer the following courses: Governance and management of the European Union; Europeanization: from partnership to membership; Foundation of the European Union; Seminar: politics and policy in Latvia. These courses will be taught by leading faculty at the Department of Political Science: Professor Žaneta Ozoliņa, Associate Professor Iveta Reinholde, Associate Professor Daunis Auers, and doctoral student Aleksandra Vonda. The courses will be taught in English.

CHECKLIST FOR PARTICIPATION

- 1. All interested applicants must be fluent in English and interested in European Union studies at the bachelors's or master's program level;
- Applicants must submit a motivation letter and CV. The Motivation letter must be submitted by 30th October 2015 and e-mailed to <u>aleksandra.vonda@lu.lv</u>. Students selected for the programme will be contacted by 20 November 2015.
- 3. The participation fee for the EU semester in Riga is 1 500 EUR;
- Students must also pay for the study visa (for more information please visit Ministry
 of Foreign Affairs website http://www.mfa.gov.lv/en/consular-information/entryinto-latvia) and insurance for the period of study;
- 5. Students must cover residence costs (around 100 EUR per month) + other expenses. Please be aware that you will have to pay for some of your meals while in Riga, we estimate it is another EUR 300 per month;
- 6. Arrival in Riga You will be responsible to travel to and from Riga at your own expense. You can easily get to Riga by air, bus or train from all major European cities.
