SPEA on the Rhine

For the fifth time, Speyer University and SPEA offer a joint summer program on **comparative public policy and administration** in Germany, the European Union, and the United States. Five seminars will provide an overview of major problems of public management, European economic integration, decision-making in the EU, local government and administrative modernization, and US and EU constitutional law.

The program will provide students with a unique opportunity to study problems of public policy and administration in **interdisciplinary and international context**.

Further highlights of the program will be **excursions** to the European Central Bank and Stock Exchange in Frankfurt, to the picturesque city of Heidelberg, to the Council of Europe in Strasbourg (France) and, for the first time, to the EU institutions in Brussels (3-day trip).

SPEA graduate students and select undergraduates will participate in the program as part of their regular program in public administration. SPEA students are able to receive **up to 6 credit points**. This would require a paper and an oral presentation in two seminars of their choice as well as two reading assignments in other courses.

Students enrolled at Speyer University are welcome to participate in one or more seminars of the program as part of their regular curriculum. Students have to meet the normal seminar requirements of Speyer University: Submission of a paper and an oral presentation of it, both in English.
